
Canoe Trip — June 6-8

We had an absolute blast last year going on our own for the first time. This year we are camping at Canoe Point on Kennabi Lake. We know that the 65th Toronto Sea Scout Troop will be at Rovers Rest the same week and we hope we can have some sailing and canoeing races with them.

This camp is the best opportunity for you to show off and improve the skills you have learned in camping, boating, leadership and cooperation. When we arrive on Saturday afternoon, there is a lot of work to do moving our gear to camp and setting up.

This camp is about the group experience. Much of our time will be spent participating in a <u>range of programs</u> around HSR. Transportation from our campsite to all programs is done by canoe and there will be opportunities to work on a number of Outdoor Adventure Skills. Sunday will be all about canoeing skills and fun in the water. Monday will be when we start travelling to programs around the camp.

While on-site, each Boat Crew will have responsibilities. There will be a Kitchen Crew and a Duty Crew each day. All of the cooking and cleaning will be done by you with Scouter support. The maintenance of the outhouse, fire, flag mast, garbage and general site cleanliness will also be carried out by Scouts.

There will be some unstructured time for whittling, game playing, writing, drawing, etc. In addition to this, there will be time for new Scouts to work on knife, axe, and stove permits and for older Scouts to advance their skills in areas of their interest.
